Treas. Bob DeSantis reported \$8,774.74 as of Aug. 31, 1989.

Liaison with County - Raleigh Allsbrook has and is doing a great job contacting people about overnite, and restricted parking, proper control of pets, leash law enforcement.

Area Improvement - Bud Bregman has taken many pictures of our troubled spots and has had good rapport with the County regarding street re-surfacing. Pot holes may be reported directly to the County or Bud will be glad to help.

Welcome & Memorials - Jean McFarlane had many memorials. Jean would appreciate contact with all new residents moving in as a good neighbor you would be of help to let her know.

Block Captains - Tom Rusch was not present due to slight health problem. All reports are he is doing fine and will keep his Block Captains busy.

Parliamentarian - Joann Buchanan substituted for Barbara Lutz. Sec. Lutz thanks you and so did the Board. Joann reported help is needed from our Lawyer at open meetings to properly handle the wording and terms in our Charter

and Incorporation. Provisions will be made for this service to be available.

Directory - Geo. Schery is at work bringing your Civic Association up to date. Some additions and deletions are necessary.

Entertainment - Harp Edwards will be home to handle our "October-fest-in-the-Park. No date has been set as yet. Notices will be posted in ample time - Same Place -- Same Good Time!!

Newsletter and Correspondence - George Wieland. A letter received from Captain Van Climie, Personnel Placemen for the Security Patrol, informed us; 128 persons are divided into 8 patrols equals 12 hours per year, or once every four months. The Pasco County Sheriff's Dept. is 100% in agreement with our Patrol.

The fact is our crime and vandalism is lower than most communities around us, this shows the deterrent affect of the CrimeWatch signs at our entrances and the physical appearance of the marked Security cars.

Problems during daylight may be lowered by having a "Daylight Patrol", 8 more people will be able to augment this. Everyone should follow a routine when leaving their homes either day or night.

1. See that all windows and doors are secured.
2. Leave a light on and/or radio playing.
3. Garage doors (a must) closed and secured.

The work of the Security Patrol should be their tour of duty for the worthwhile results to us, all in the Valley benefit. Your Board feels the Civic Association, Inc. should include the Security Watch Patrol expenses in the budget. Members of the Patrol use their personal cars, pay for the gasoline, some have their own C.B.'s (necessary for Patrol. All suspicious actions are reported by C.B. No one leaves their auto.)

Reasonable expenses are: equipment repair, new equipment, office supplies, ID Red Ball stickers. A motion by G. Wieland and seconded by G. Schery to include the expenses incurred by the Security Patrol to be paid from the Civic Association, Inc. treasury. Passed by full majority. Capt. Van Climie and his officers was advised to meet with a committee from the Board for the purpose of having a "Committe-of-One" responsible to the Board. The Board extends to all workers of the Patrol an invitation to attend at the Club Dining Room, 2:30 P.M., Nov. 14, 1989 the monthly Civic Assoc. Meeting. A social hour in appreciation for jobs well done will follow a very short meeting. Suggestions from the Patrol will be appreciated.
